Content

Mediation is a modern, flexible, and effective process for solving disputes and making joint decisions in important matters. Through mediation, family members, colleagues, business partners – basically everybody who has an interest in respectful cooperative relationships - can potentially have meaningful discussions, gain a better understanding of each other's perspectives, and regain mutual trust. The goal of each mediation should be to find enduring solutions that are in the best interest of everybody involved.

This seminar will introduce the basic principles, methods, and techniques of mediation. Through discussions and interactive exercises students will acquire mediation skills as well as practical communication skills that can be applied to any social encounter.
