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19. *Chlorophytum comosum* (L.) Willd. ex Ait. (Asparagaceae). - This is a common species throughout the tropics, especially in the drier parts of Africa and Asia. It is a clump-forming plant with long, thin, strap-like leaves, each ending in a sharp point. The flowers are small and white, arranged in a terminal panicle. The plant is often cultivated as an ornamental in gardens and along roadsides.

20. *Clivia miniata* (L.) Ker Gawler (Amaryllidaceae). - This is a popular houseplant from South Africa, characterized by its large, showy, orange-red flowers arranged in a terminal spike. The leaves are thick and strap-like. Clivias are relatively easy to grow and can tolerate some shade.

21. *Cyperus rotundus* L. (Cyperaceae). - This is a common sedge found in many parts of the world, particularly in Europe and North America. It has a creeping rhizome and produces clusters of small, yellowish flowers. The leaves are narrow and grass-like. Cyperus rotundus is often used as a ground cover or in water gardens.

22. *Dianthus barbatus* L. (Caryophyllaceae). - This is a small, annual flowering plant from Europe and the Mediterranean region. It has a compact, rounded habit and bears clusters of fragrant, five-petaled flowers in shades of red, pink, and white. Dianthus barbatus is commonly known as sweet William or pinks.

23. *Euphorbia pulcherrima* (L.) Willd. ex Ait. (Euphorbiaceae). - This is a tropical evergreen shrub native to Mexico and Central America. It is widely cultivated for its bright red, star-shaped flowers and succulent, fleshy leaves. Euphorbia pulcherrima is often used as a potted plant or in hanging baskets.

24. *Gardenia jasminoides* (L.) Don (Guttiferae). - This is a tropical evergreen shrub or small tree native to East Africa and southern Asia. It is highly valued for its fragrant, white flowers and glossy, dark green leaves. Gardenia jasminoides is often grown as a specimen plant or in containers.

25. *Hedychium coronarium* (L.) Nees (Zingiberaceae). - This is a tropical herbaceous plant from Southeast Asia and the Pacific Islands. It has a fibrous root system and produces clusters of fragrant, bell-shaped flowers in shades of yellow, orange, and red. Hedychium coronarium is often used as a ground cover or in mixed borders.

26. *Hyacinthus orientalis* L. (Hyacinthaceae). - This is a bulbous flowering plant from the Mediterranean region and Central Asia. It has a strong, sweet fragrance and produces clusters of bell-shaped flowers in shades of blue, purple, and white. Hyacinthus orientalis is a classic spring-flowering bulb.

27. *Lavandula angustifolia* (L.) Mill. (Lamiaceae). - This is a aromatic shrub from the Mediterranean region and Southern Europe. It has opposite, linear leaves and whorls of purple, two-lipped flowers. Lavandula angustifolia is widely used in perfumery and as a medicinal herb.

28. *Leucadendron salignum* (L.) R. Br. (Proteaceae). - This is a tall, evergreen tree from South Africa, belonging to the Proteaceae family. It has large, showy, bell-shaped flowers in shades of yellow, orange, and red. Leucadendron salignum is a valuable timber tree and is also used for its decorative value.

29. *Magnolia liliiflora* (Thunb.) Reichenb. (Magnoliaceae). - This is a large, evergreen tree from Japan and China. It has large, fragrant, white flowers with distinct petals. Magnolia liliiflora is a slow-growing tree and is often used as a specimen plant or in large gardens.

30. *Malva sylvestris* L. (Malvaceae). - This is a biennial or short-lived perennial flowering plant from Europe and Northern Africa. It has large, deeply lobed leaves and clusters of pink, purple, or white flowers. Malva sylvestris is often used as a ground cover or in wildflower meadows.
